Entry requirements

- Be a minimum age of 16 years old or over
- Unique Student Identifier (USI)
- Hold a current Working With Children Check (WWCC) or ability to obtain one prior to attending work experience and field days
- Complete the pre-enrolment process including the pre-enrolment Language, Literacy and Numeracy assessment.
- Hold a Covid19 vaccination certificate

Work experience requirements

This qualification requires students to complete at least **160 hours** of work in a regulated children's education and care service. During work experience, students must provide & wear their own sun safe, industry appropriate clothing & a hat and be able to travel to the host employer.

The course

The CHC30121 Certificate III in Early Childhood and Care qualification provides students with the skills, knowledge and qualification required to work in a regulated early childhood setting. The qualification has 17 units of competence – 15 core and 2 electives.



Each unit covers the key skills and knowledge required to practice as a qualified Early Childhood Educator. Students will learn how to:

- Safely care for babies, toddlers and young children from 0-5 years
- Understand the theory behind how a child develops and grows
- Plan creative and fun experiences that foster the child's development, wellbeing and creativity
- Develop rewarding and positive relationships with children and their families
- Understand the legislative and regulatory frameworks that govern the industry and ensure you work legally and ethically
- Understand the importance of cultural competence and how to ensure all families and children are cared for in an inclusive environment
- Perform the principles of **First Aid – HLTAID012 Provide an emergency first aid response in an education and care setting** - requires a physical capability of performing uninterrupted CPR for at least 2 minutes on an adult/child resuscitation manikin placed on the floor.

All learning and assessment resources are provided by Benchmark College. To complete the self-directed learning and assessment component, access to the internet and a computer is also required.

Government funding*

This training is subsidised by the NSW Government. To be eligible to receive funding, the following eligibility criteria must be met:

- be an Australian citizen, an Australian permanent resident, a humanitarian visa holder or a New Zealand citizen and;
- be aged 15 years or older and;
- have left school and;
- live or work in New South Wales

How the course works

Workplace-based

Students enrolling in this program must be working full-time or part-time in a regulated Early Childhood Education and Care Service. For those in a full-time traineeship, a minimum of 30 hours or more per week (averaged over a 4-week period) is required to be worked. A qualified trainer/assessor visits the student in the workplace every 4-6 weeks over the course of their traineeship. In addition to the face-to-face learning support, students' progress and learning support, students will be offered assistance with their studies via phone, email or online in between workplace visits.

This course is also available as a School Based Traineeship for Year 10, 11 and 12 high school students. A school-based traineeship combines paid work, training and school with a nationally recognised qualification, whilst gaining credit towards the HSC. Practical and work-related activities designed to allow each student the opportunity to apply their learning in a real work environment are undertaken. These activities will vary, e.g. research an organisational policy and procedure, watch a colleague complete a particular task, buddy with a colleague on a particular shift or gain experience in undertaking a particular activity. This is recorded by students and supervisors in the required documentation. Students/trainees complete work-based activities for units relevant to this qualification. The trainer/assessor checks the evidence for each cluster/ unit with the workplace supervisor and student and signs off to verify the on-the-job training.

Students also attend group training for first aid. Workplace based students undertake classroom training for this unit.

Classroom

Students enrolling in this program are required to attend class 1-2 days per week from 9:00am – 4:00pm. The remaining 2 days are dedicated to self-directed learning and assessment activities. Students are also required to attend 24 field days and six (6) weeks of work experience.

This program includes training sessions and a range of interactive activities designed to build student's underpinning knowledge and develop competence in each unit. Students will also get the opportunity to practice and apply their learning by practicing key skills such as changing a nappy, preparing formula and creating fun learning experiences for children in a safe and simulated environment.

Work Experience

Classroom students participate in Work Experience. This provides students with opportunities to:

- Practice newly learnt skills and apply theory learnt in the classroom.
- Build the skills that employers want like teamwork, communication and reliability.
- Increase confidence and show individuals they are ready for work.

Benchmark College will organise work experience for all classroom-based students and will provide insurance and support in the work place. Students will be buddied with an experienced employee and will be visited at least once by a Trainer. Students on work experience are given a range of activities to guide their learning and practice the key skills required to become work ready.

From week 6, students commence work experience "field days" with a Host Employer, 1 day per week (i.e. 2 days in the classroom and 1 day in the field), 26 field days in total.

Students are also required to complete 2, fifteen-day work experience blocks – Monday to Friday – 38 hours per week. Start and finish times may vary depending on the early childhood service.

Students must provide and wear their own sun safe, industry appropriate clothing & a hat whilst on work experience. Travel to and from the host employer is the student's responsibility.

Please note that this qualification requires students to complete a total of at least **160 hours** of work in a regulated children's education and care service.

Self-directed learning and assessment activities – All students

Self-directed learning activities may vary from reading a textbook to online research. Workplace-based/ traineeship students can expect to dedicate approximately 8-10 hours per week to self-directed learning and assessment task completion; or approximately 14hrs (2 days) per week for classroom-based students.

To ensure that students are safe and work ready, they will need to complete a range of assessment tasks that include answering questions, analysing case studies and completing practical work-based tasks. Trainers will also observe students perform a range of skills in the workplace and in the classroom, and on work experience for classroom-based students.

Course pre-requisites and suitability

This course is designed for students who want to enter the Early Childhood Education and Care industry and have no early childhood industry experience.

The course has no pre-requisite requirements, although students must have a Unique Student Identifier, clear a NSW Working with Children Check and pass our language literacy, numeracy and digital quiz. Enrolling students must be able to provide a copy of the Vaccination Certificate, as per the Public Health (Covid-19 Vaccination of Education and Care Workers) Order 2021,

(1) *The Minister directs that an education and care worker must not carry out relevant work on or after 8 November 2021 unless the worker has— (a) had 2 doses of a COVID-19 vaccine, or (b) been issued with a medical contraindication certificate*¹

Can I get credit for previous study?

If students have previously completed a Nationally Recognised Qualification or Course they must inform us at the time of application by providing a transcript and completing the relevant Verification and Consent Form. We will then verify if any units listed in the transcript can be credited towards the qualification.

Fees and charges

Traineeship fees are capped at \$1,000. The classroom-based course is \$1600 (first qualification fee) if eligible for and accessing a government subsidised place. Students eligible for a concession are required to pay \$240. This fee covers enrolment, tuition and learning resources. Fees must be paid in accordance with the **Fee Schedule**.
